Introduction

Integral to our vision at Vale Community Church is to 'love people'.

We are committed to caring for each other and sharing life together. Lots of support at Vale Community Church happens quite naturally and informally in day to day life but there are times in our lives when we need some extra support and care.

This leaflet outlines some of the ways which we offer support and care. It includes a brief description of the support on offer along with contact details to help you access the care more easily. So, if you need support, please don't hesitate to contact us - we want to help.

How & Where does Pastoral Care Happen?

Most of the care and prayer in Vale Community Church happens informally and spontaneously through existing relationships. Pastoral care and prayer can flow naturally from normal conversations - after a Sunday service or at any time. It happens through existing friendships and in the groups to which you belong, such as Life Groups.

The **Minister** is also available to chat or to pray with people after Sunday worship - just have a quiet word in his ear at the end of the service.

Sundays

Pastoral care is expressed in our worship together. As the church family draws close to God in worship, we also draw closer to one another. In worship we receive from God the spiritual resources we need to live well as followers of Jesus. In worship we also pray for one another, encourage one another and build one another up.

Life Groups

Life Groups are the place where people can grow as disciples of Jesus, get involved in the life of the Church, discover and practice their spiritual gifts and develop their prayer lives. They are places where friendships can be established, grow and develop. Life Groups are where much of the pastoral care takes place in the church.

Pastoral Oversight

You may not be in a Life Group or you may find yourself in a situation where you need to look for support beyond your Life Group. You may just need to have someone to take the time to listen as you discuss a problem or current issue in your life: something that might not require counselling. It may be that you need to talk to someone to find out how the church can support you while you are dealing with a particular issue in your life.

Liz Edwards who has Pastoral Oversight can be contacted confidentially via phone to discuss what support you may need and to discern how this could be met utilising the resources within the church as appropriate. The support we can offer is varied and depends on the set of circumstances you may find yourself in.

Pastoral Care Visiting Team

Individuals from this team are available to come to your home or to hospital to actively engage in listening to you and to pray as appropriate.

Prayer Ministry

Prayer is available to everyone at the end of each of our Sunday services. It is completely confidential and you don't need to explain why you are asking for prayer. Specific individual times of prayer ministry can be arranged through the Minister but the expectation is that the majority of prayer ministry occurs after services or in Life Groups.

Counselling Service

This is a confidential service provided by experienced staff and trained volunteers. There is no charge for this service but an affordable donation is appreciated.
